#### Flu Shot

The flu is a highly contagious respiratory illness that is caused by a virus. For individuals with CF, getting the flu may cause worse symptoms and lead to a faster decline in lung function. The flu can lead to severe lung infections, like pneumonia. The flu shot can reduce the risk of getting the flu by helping the body fight off or increase its immunity to the virus. The best time to get the flu shot is in September or October, but getting vaccinated in December or January is still helpful as the flu season can last until spring. In our CF Center, only 71% of patients obtained the flu shot so far this season. We hope that this percentage continues to increase! Other ways to reduce the risk of obtaining the flu are: cleaning your hands with soap and water or use an alcohol-based hand gel (especially after

coughing or sneezing). Always cover your mouth when you cough. Use a tissue when you cough or sneeze and if you do not have a tissue readily available, cough or sneeze into your inner elbow. Another way to prevent the flu is to stay at least 6 feet away from anyone who has a cold. Lastly, practice good health habits such as getting plenty of sleep, drink adequate amounts of fluid, eat highly nutritious food, be physically active, and manage your stress. ## Equipment Checks

Equipment checks are very important. Please bring your equipment once a year to clinic with you. The purpose of these checks are to make sure vests are fitting appropriately, vest parameters are at optimal settings, airway clearance technique is being performed the best way possible, and the nebulizer compressor is strong enough to deliver all medications. Surprisingly, we have already found several nebulizers that

were not strong enough to perform the treatments in a timely fashion and needed to be replaced. So, please make arrangements to bring in your equipment and nebulizer compressor at your next office visit. We want to ensure that you are getting the most out of your respiratory equipment.






# Infection Control Outside of APH CF Clinic

We recommend using infection control measures even outside of the Cystic Fibrosis Clinic. If you have CF, for your safely, please wear a mask when in common areas such as any medical related waiting area, bathroom, hallway, etc. If you are admitted to the hospital, tell your nurse that you should be on contact isolation immediately. This means that medical staff will wear a gown and gloves every time they enter the room. This helps prevent infections from being spread.

The CF Foundation recommends that other facilities also do their best to room patients' with CF as quickly as possible, even if it means having to wait longer inside of the room. This is to reduce the risk of infection. This is something that you can talk to your pediatrician and other specialists about. If this is not something they can do, ask if you can wait outside away from other sick patients. Also consider bringing disinfecting wipes to public places to clean surfaces that may be contaminated.
